Critical Resistance (CR) has worked tirelessly to build campaigns and projects, craft analysis, and develop political education materials to guide us toward the future we want and need. The success of this year's art auction is crucial to our work and our ability to continue to be timely and responsive. The majority of CR's resources continue to come from grassroots supporters who give money, time, and skills to keep our organization stable and ready to carry out campaigns, projects, political education and movement building efforts. Every gift will help CR continue to chip away at the prison industrial complex and put abolition into practice.

**Here is a list of what your commitment and donations make possible for CR...**

<b>\$15</b>	covers printing and mailing of 3 issues of The Abolitionist newspaper to 3 imprisoned readers
<b>\$50</b>	covers printing and materials for one political education workshop or skills training
<b>\$75</b>	covers food for a campaign, coalition or political education meeting
<b>\$200</b>	covers one month of website hosting and digital secure email lists
<b>\$300</b>	covers one month of phone and internet, including answering daily collect calls from imprisoned organizers
<b>\$500</b>	covers one month of mailing political organizing resources to imprisoned organizers all across the country
<b>\$1,000</b>	covers costs for a Training of Trainers session to skill up members to lead political education workshops and campaigns
<b>\$3,000</b>	covers one month of office rental + meeting space for our Oakland and National office in downtown Oakland, CA
<b>\$5,000</b>	covers one month of health and worker benefits for all CR staff
<b>\$14,000</b>	covers printing and mailing of the 3 issues of The Abolitionist newspaper to go to over 7,000 imprisoned subscribers
<b>\$55,000</b>	covers one year of a staff salary to skill up volunteer chapter members and to coordinate campaigns and projects.
<b>\$60,000</b>	covers the unanticipated expenses CR shouldered to respond to Covid-19 Shelter-in-Pace restrictions and pivot to online, socially distanced organizing so CR staff and members could continue essential organizing in 2020.
