In 1959, the city jail population reached a record high of 8,613 people. A new jail opened in 1961 in Kew Gardens and was set to replace the Queens County Jail in Long Island City, then 75 years old.

However, the old jail was kept open due to alleged "overcrowding" and did not close for good until 1975.

In 2002, the Kew Gardens jail was also closed in response to budget cuts. While the jail has not been re-opened, the city continues to spend money to maintain the jail.

In 1988, two former British troop barges, the Bibby Resolution and the Bibby Venture were bought by the City and floated in the Hudson River and East River as jails. The barges later sat empty from 1992 to 1994, and in 1994 Mayor Giuliani sold the barges to a European company, saying "they were a drain on the budget."

Two former Staten Island ferries, the Walter Keane and the Harold A. Wildstein were moored at Rikers Island beginning in 1987. The DOC stopped using the boats at Rikers in 1997, and the ferries were sold for scrap.
